
WANT TO BE KIDNAPPED.

Two American Girls Said to be on Their Way to Macedonia with That Object.

PARIS, Nov. 14.—The Turkish Government is much exercised over a report that two American girls, named Delauney and Stetson, have started for Turkey with the idea of getting captured by brigands in a manner similar to the capture of Miss Stone. The Turkish Embassy here has received a dispatch instructing the officials to investigate the matter and endeavor to ascertain the girls' whereabouts, as it is thought that they will pass through Paris.

A dispatch from Philadelphia, published here on Nov. 2, announced that two girls, Kate Boyle and Flora Preston, had started for Macedonia with the idea of getting abducted by brigands. Possibly this was the origin of the Porte's perturbation.
